

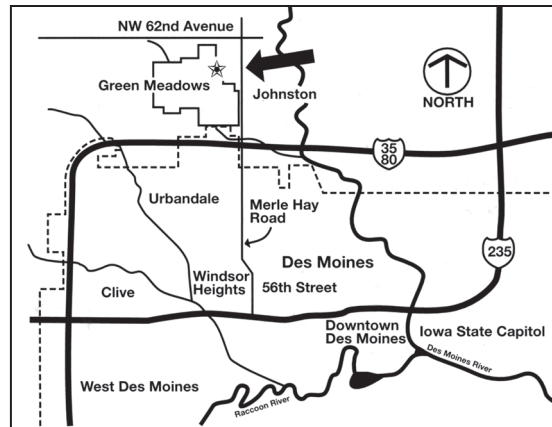
A History of Caring

Originally established in 1939—named after the Most Reverend Thomas W. Drumm, Bishop of the Des Moines Catholic Diocese from 1919 to 1933—Bishop Drumm Retirement Center was founded by the Religious Sisters of Mercy and is a subsidiary of Mercy Medical Center—Des Moines and a member of the Mercy Health Network.

Bishop Drumm is also an affiliate of Catholic Health Initiatives and offers equal opportunity housing. The care center is open to people of all faiths.

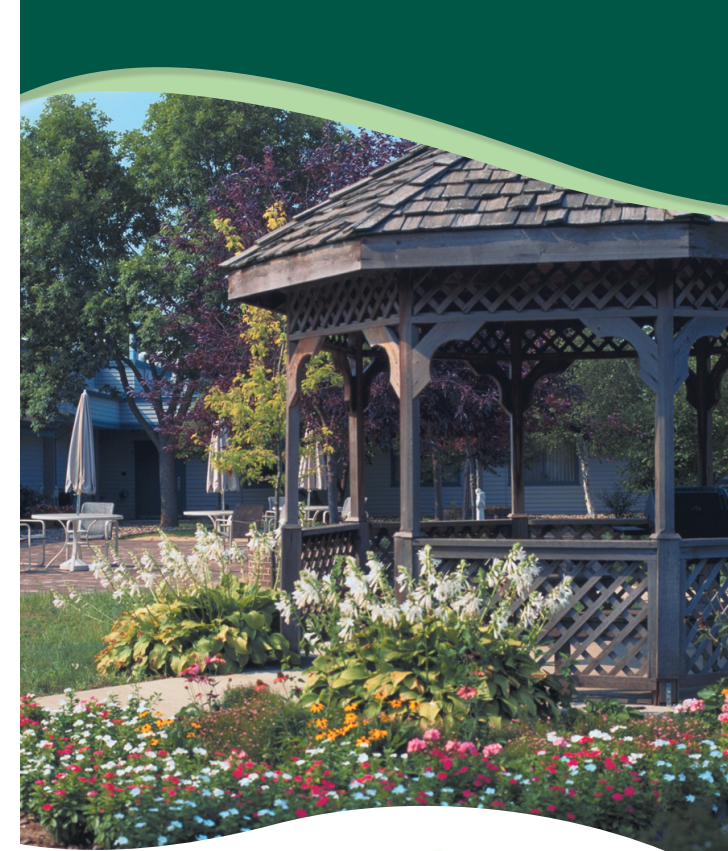

Bishop Drumm Care Center is a licensed, skilled nursing facility offering quality care to 150 residents with special attention to each individual's personal and health care needs. Residents in the facility generally require some type of nursing care due to illness, disease, physical or intellectual infirmity. Licensed personnel are on duty 24-hours a day to provide for the various needs of residents.

Focused on the Individual

Located on a beautifully landscaped, 15-acre campus, the care center offers high-quality care with a Christian approach. Open to people of all faiths, the staff care for the whole person—mind, body and spirit. The continuing presence of the Sisters of Mercy provides that special quality of Christian love and understanding that has endured at Bishop Drumm since 1939. The care center is part of the Bishop Drumm Retirement Center, a not-for-profit continuing care retirement community located in Johnston, Iowa. Also located on the campus are McAuley Terrace independent living apartments, and Martina Place, an assisted living residence. Residents of McAuley Terrace and Martina Place receive priority status on the waiting list for admission to Bishop Drumm.

Special Needs and Activities

As a Medicare certified facility, our skilled and experienced nursing professionals can provide expanded medical care to meet each resident's needs.

A wide variety of personalized programs and services are also offered.

- Margery Court is located within the care center, offering specially trained staff to help residents with dementia. The staff helps residents maintain the highest level of emotional, spiritual and physical functioning.
- Daily mass and special interfaith services are offered in Our Lady of Peace Chapel. The resident chaplain conducts Bible study and offers private counseling.
- The Schildberg Physical Therapy Room is designed for the special therapy needs of residents.
- A barber/beauty salon is available.
- A wide variety of activities and programs are offered to keep residents active and involved. Monthly birthday parties, holiday meals, games, entertainment, pet therapy programs and many other activities provide recreational opportunities for residents.

Supporting Our Residents

The Bishop Drumm Development Office supports Bishop Drumm Retirement Center by aiding financial stability and future growth of the organization. The Development Committee is engaged in various annual and deferred giving programs which help the Sisters of Mercy continue to operate a quality health care facility at Bishop Drumm.

The Bishop Drumm Guild is a volunteer organization which regularly sponsors a wide variety of programs and activities for residents. The Guild members volunteer at the care center each week to join with residents for parties and games. Guild members also sponsor fund-raising programs for the facility.

Financial Arrangements

Bishop Drumm Retirement Center has trained financial counselors available to discuss financial needs. The care center is certified for the Medicare and Medicaid programs, both of which can provide some financial assistance to qualified residents who are not able to pay the entire cost of care. The care provided to residents is never based on the resident's ability to pay.
