CLINIC SERVICES

We offer the full spectrum of perinatal services, including:

- Obstetric consultations for maternal and fetal indications
- Obstetric ultrasounds at all gestational ages and for all indications (first trimester, cervical length, complete obstetric, comprehensive obstetric, fetal echocardiogram, biophysical profile and 3D/4D ultrasound)
- Preconceptual and prenatal genetic counseling
- Invasive prenatal testing (amniocentesis, chorionic villus sampling and cordocentesis)
- Antenatal testing
- Obstetric management
- First trimester nuchal translucency

HOSPITAL SERVICES

The majority of patients referred to PCI for inpatient services will receive care at Mercy Medical Center – Des Moines' Women & Infants' Center.

The Maternity Triage & Treatment Unit includes:

- High risk antepartum unit staffed by specialized obstetrical nurses and ultrasonographers
- Obstetric ultrasound available 24 hours and read by PCI physicians
- Capability for invasive fetal assessment and treatment (i.e., cordocentesis, shunt placement)

Birthing Unit


- Critical Care Obstetric Unit – staffed by the PCI physicians, along with a core group of nurses who have received additional training and education in critical care obstetrics

OUR STAFF

The doctors and staff of PCI are specially trained in caring for expecting mothers and their babies. Our staff consists of board-certified maternal-fetal medicine doctors, a nurse practitioner and physician assistant, one of central Iowa's only certified genetic counselors and registered ultrasonographers with a combined experience of more than 100 years doing obstetric ultrasound.
