Volunteering is rewarding and fun, but demands a significant service-based commitment on your part. At Mercy, our patients, visitors and staff benefit greatly when volunteers serve on a regular, long-term basis. Therefore, Mercy volunteers are asked to commit to a regular (usually, weekly) schedule of shifts which are typically four hours in length (although shifts may vary by assignment). Most of our volunteers average 100-200 service hours annually. As a result, we ask that you carefully consider your schedule and your abilities before you apply to volunteer at Mercy.

APPLICATION PROCESS

- Attend a Volunteer Open House

Due to the uniqueness of volunteering in a hospital, all prospective volunteers are required to attend a Volunteer Open House prior to initiating an application. When you attend one of these sessions, you will meet staff from Mercy's Volunteer Services Department, learn more about the application process, receive your application materials (which includes an Authorization to Conduct a Background Check form) and hear more about volunteer opportunities. Volunteer Open Houses are conveniently offered at a variety of times and locations throughout the year.

- Complete a Volunteer Interview/New Volunteer Health Screening

At the Volunteer Interview, we will discuss your skills, experience, availability and areas of interest to determine the best fit for you within our volunteer program. We will also review the requirements of volunteers in Mercy's health care facilities and explain our New Volunteer Health Screening process through our Employee Health Services (EHS) office. Upon clearing the Health Screening in its entirety, the EHS nurse will issue you a clearance statement which allows you to contact Volunteer Services and schedule your New Volunteer Orientation.

- Attend New Volunteer Orientation

At New Volunteer Orientation, you will learn more about Mercy Medical Center – Des Moines, discover the many ways volunteers support Mercy's mission and receive health and safety information related to your responsibilities as a volunteer. Upon completing New Volunteer Orientation, your volunteer placement will be confirmed and you will receive your first volunteer assignment.
